CWSF Executive Committee Retreat Recap

The Council of Western State Foresters (CWSF) Executive Committee (EC) met in Denver, CO, on June 30 for an in-person executive retreat. The EC reviewed and provided feedback on the CWSF Strategic Plan. CWSF staff members provided updates on various performance measures and discussed any outstanding items and next steps. Discussion centered around finding ways to increase the CWSF operating reserve fund, expanding member-focused opportunities, staff development, broadening new partnerships, and best practices for implementation of the strategic plan. The EC also reviewed and approved revisions to the CWSF policies and concluded the meeting with a closed business session regarding the 2017 budget.

Western Competitive Grant Portal

CWSF continues to move forward with the grants web portal project with an expected completion date of August 2016. This project includes portals for the Western Landscape Scale Restoration (LSR) and the Western Wildland Urban Interface (WUI) grant process as well as the Southern Group of State Foresters' LSR grant. These portals make applying, reviewing and scoring much easier and allow for a search function and historical database for the CWSF and SGSF. New for 2017, the CWSF WUI grant process includes online forms for use by the local cooperators requesting funding from the states. The Western LSR web portal and the Western WUI grant portal are now open and accepting applications for the 2017 grant cycle. Climate Change RFP

 CWSF has selected the Yale Center for Environmental Law & Policy as the winning proposal to complete the Climate Change Synthesis project. This project will analyze and synthesize the work that the Western states and Pacific islands are currently undertaking on issues related to the changing climate. The project will span several months with a completion date in October 2016.

True Cost of Wildfire RFP

 CWSF is seeking assistance in updating the Western Forestry Leadership Coalition (WFLC) True Cost of Wildfire in the Western U.S. report originally published in 2009 and updated in 2010. CWSF extended the reviewing deadline to July 15, 2016 to ensure adequate time for feedback from the reviewing team. A decision and the accepted proposal will be determined soon.

- CWSF staff participated at the Collaborative Restoration Workshop hosted by the National Forest Foundation, April 26 – April 27. The workshop acted as a forum for "sharing innovative approaches to collaborative restoration, tools, and lessons about planning, implementing, and monitoring restoration efforts on and around National Forest System lands." CWSF staff attended on behalf of the WFLC. Over 300 Forest Service, state agency, local, regional and national partners participated at the event.
- CWSF assisted Alaska State Forester, Chris Maisch, and NASF in preparation for Chris' testimony during the Senate Energy and Natural Resources Committee field hearing in Kenai, Alaska. The hearing purpose was to examine the challenges and impacts of federal regulations and wildfire management on outdoor recreation, hunting and fishing opportunities, and tourism on public lands on the Kenai Peninsula.
