2020 ACCOMPLISHMENTS

KEY ACCOMPLISHMENTS FROM 2020

- The FUN hosted the annual meeting virtually with presentations from state and federal forestry agency staff and private sector and nongovernmental partners.
- FUN members contributed content for a CWSF publication featuring forest utilization success stories from 11 western states.
- The FUN developed Terms of Reference for engaging a CWSF procured contractor to conduct an emerging
 market analysis focusing on international wood energy export markets. Future Metrics, a leading expert in the
 sector, was awarded the contract. FUN members were able to increase the budget authorized by CWSF
 (\$10,000) by contributing an additional \$17,000 of state funds.
- The FUN secured an additional \$50,000 in funding from the USDA Forest Service Forest Products Lab (FPL) for building network capacity and strategic wood utilization work in the region. These funds were awarded via a grant held by the University of Nebraska and administered by the Nebraska Forest Service.
- The network continued engagement with National Fire Adapted Communities Learning Network through their Wood Utilization Community of Practice, a cross-network collaboration and information sharing hub.
