SUBJECT: FY 2025 Western States' State Fire Assistance WUI Competitive Grant Recommendations

The Council of Western State Foresters (CWSF) requests that the USDA Forest Service (USFS) State, Private, and Tribal Forestry disburse Fiscal Year 2025 National Fire Plan (NFP) State Fire Assistance (SFA) competitive funding to the western states according to the enclosed table.

The Western State Fire Managers' (WSFM) Wildland Urban Interface Grant Committee met in person in Omaha, NE during the month of December 2024, prior to the initiation of the grant review period. 76 eligible grant applications submitted by 15 western states/islands and requesting a total of \$21,036,068 were received, reviewed, scored, and prioritized by the Committee. The enclosed table reflects the distribution of \$13,942,000 towards 52 grants. The CWSF Executive Committee discussed and approved the western recommendations at the estimated \$13,618,000 funding level, which has been updated to reflect the funding level now indicated by the USFS after appropriations were finalized and adjusted for two applications withdrawn from consideration post-scoring.

Many successful applications will go unfunded. The rigorous process established in the West to review, rank, and select applications allows any additional funds from your office to be distributed to the next application(s) in queue; the CWSF respectfully requests such distribution of additional funds should they become available.
