MISSION STATEMENT AND PURPOSE

The mission of the GNA Committee is to perform as an exemplary network within the Council of Western State Foresters (CWSF) to share information and resources; advise state and federal leadership, staff, and partners through expert technical guidance; and provide recommendations for policy improvements regarding federal forest management, shared stewardship, and the use of the GNA to western state foresters and their federal counterparts.

2023 ACCOMPLISHMENTS AND RECOMMENDATIONS

KEY ACCOMPLISHMENTS FROM 2023

- Shared information, best practices, and conducted peer learning about GNA and its implementation in western states.
- Held its first multi-day in-person meeting, which included dialogue with the USDA Forest Service GNA
 Washington Office (WO) Program Manager and the GNA WO Grants and Agreements lead, a State Forester
 speaker panel, discussions with county and tribal representatives, and a field tour.
- Provided subject matter expertise to inform CWSF and National Association of State Foresters (NASF)
 engagement in regional and national level GNA policy issues.
- Assisted in developing and contributing content to the Western Forestry Leadership Coalition (WFLC) GNA
 Resources webpage and contributed monthly state spotlights on GNA projects in the West.
- Voted at the 2023 first annual meeting to become a standing CWSF committee. An established workgroup developed a proposed mission, purpose, and draft Committee Charter for review and approval by CWSF.

- In partnership with CWSF staff, crafted the first Western State Forestry Agencies GNA Activities and Accomplishments publication.

2024 WORK PLAN

MEETING(S) AND CALLS PLANNED FOR 2024

- Annual in-person meeting in Tucson, Arizona, April 2-4, 2024.
 - o This would be the second in-person meeting for the GNA Task Force/Committee and would allow for state and federal GNA staff networking, information sharing, peer learning, and a local field tour showcasing GNA projects and activities.
 - o 75% expected GNA membership attendance

METHOD OF COMMUNICATION

KEY ACTIVITIES, DELIVERABLES, AND OUTCOMES PLANNED FOR 2024

- Continue to share information, lessons learned, and helpful resources on GNA topics impacting western state forestry agencies.
- Provide a platform for state forestry agency staff with GNA responsibilities to daylight emerging issues in their states and elevate issues, as appropriate, to the CWSF membership for discussion and/or action.
- Inform CWSF's GNA engagement and position CWSF to be a resource for members, NASF, and the other regional State Forester associations, partners, Congress, and the Administration.
- Strategically engage WFLC USDA Forest Service and Bureau of Land Management partners at appropriate levels (e.g., Washington Office, regions, districts, forest units) to strengthen GNA coordination and implementation across all-lands.
- Exploring the feasibility of State-to-State agreements for GNA resources.
- Establish common data reporting questions/metrics for western state forestry agencies and update the Western State Forestry Agencies GNA Activities and Accomplishments publication.
- Targeted discussions regarding impacts to GNA implementation from possible legislative changes (e.g., Farm Bill Good Neighbor Authority, federal appropriations, etc.) and, where possible, establishing a unified western voice on issues and successes that stem from any changes.
- Explore pros and cons of standardization and/or best practices in GNA implementation, tracking and reporting across western states.
