

Wyoming State Forester

Advance your career as a leader in western forestry! The Wyoming State Forestry Division (WSFD) is a division of the Office of State Lands and Investments. As the leader of WSFD, you will be responsible for forest management on forested state trust land, wildfire suppression and management on 3.5 million acres of state trust land, fire management coordination on 29 million acres of private land, community forestry, private landowner assistance, forest legacy, fuels management, and forest health.

The State Forester is appointed by and reports to the State Board of Land Commissioners. The Board of Land Commissioners is made up of the five statewide elected officials (Governor, Secretary of State, State Auditor, State Treasurer, and the Superintendent of Public Instruction).

The position is located in Cheyenne, Wyoming. Cheyenne is a full-service community, home to about 80,000 residents. Cheyenne is close to great outdoor recreation areas including the Snowy Range and the Medicine Bow National Forest, home to world class rock climbing at Vedauwoo. In addition, the location provides convenient access to the Colorado Front Range communities including Ft. Collins, and Denver.

By state statute, the position requires, at a minimum a Bachelor's Degree in Forestry, and a minimum of four years of experience in professional forestry work.
